Jordan accepted a temporary job at Paychex Inc., a leading payroll, human resources and benefits outsourcing company. The task of compiling W-2 information was tedious, so during her free time at home and during breaks, Jordan devised a spreadsheet program that simplified and sped up the process. Her supervisor was impressed and asked if she was looking for a full-time position.

Within weeks, she was hired as a client-service representative and was sent to the company's headquarters in Rochester, N.Y., for two weeks of specialized training. AbilityLinks made it easy for Paychex
